- Offering a true interdisciplinary approach – urologic oncologists work directly with radiation oncologists, medical oncologists, interventional radiologists and other specialists – in a single location
- Regular tumor boards review each case to form optimal treatment plans.
- All available surgical and interventional techniques (open and minimally invasive options)
- Urologic oncologists specialize in and have extensive training and experience in technique focused treatments
- Offering medical therapies and combination therapies for more advanced or recurrent cancers; radiation therapy as palliative treatment
- All minimally invasive treatment approaches, including robotic-assisted surgery, laparoscopic surgery, percutaneous cryoablation
- Highest kidney preservation rate in Wisconsin (at 57 percent, compared to average 31 percent)
- One of highest volume centers in the nation for kidney cancer cryoablation
- Specializing in complex cases, as well as early stage kidney cancer
- Clinical trials available – team is consistently active in collaborative research initiatives in cooperation with national organizations such as the National Cancer Institute, the American Surgical Oncology Group and others
