For outpatients with complicated short and long-term infections or HIV/AIDS, the Infectious Disease Clinic is located on the 4th floor of the Specialty Clinics building. It is staffed by Medical College of Wisconsin faculty and nurse practitioners, and is open Monday–Friday, 8 a.m.–4:30 p.m., except on holidays.
