



Immunization Records

For a Job Shadow/Observer experience, Froedtert Health currently requires the following documented health requirements:

- Documentation/Proof of 2 (two) doses of **MMR** (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) vaccine or documented proof of positive MMR titer (blood test)
- Documentation/Proof of Tuberculosis (**TB**) Surveillance; provide **ONE** of the following:
 - Negative TB Skin Test (dated within 12 months of observation start date)
 - Negative Quantiferon Gold Blood Test (dated within 12 months of observation start date)
 - Chest X-ray Negative for TB (dated within 6 months of observation start date)
- *****See below for resources if you need to obtain a TB Skin Test*****
- Documentation/Proof of 1 (one) dose of **Influenza** vaccine if observation occurs during influenza season (approximately September 1 through March 30)

To obtain Immunization Records, you may check with:

- Your parents
- Primary Care Provider
- Epic MyChart
- Cerner Patient Solutions
- Local Health Department if immunizations provided there

*****Please note:**

We require DOCUMENTED PROOF of the immunizations and TB Skin Test, not just a date.

If you require influenza vaccine (during flu season) or MMR vaccine, the resources listed below for TB Skin Tests also generally offer immunizations.



TB Skin Test Resources

The TB skin test, also called the Mantoux tuberculin skin test (TST) requires two visits with a health care provider. The TB skin test is performed by injecting a small amount of fluid (called tuberculin) into the skin on the lower part of the inner arm. The test is placed on the first visit. The healthcare provider “reads” the placement area on a second visit, 48 to 72 hours after the test is placed, to determine a positive or negative reaction. (Centers for Disease Control, 2016.
