

Student Validation Information

- Physical Examination by primary healthcare provider (MD, APNP or PA) 3 months prior to initial clinical start with annual history update & verification to include:
 - student is free of communicable disease
 - student is able to meet physical demands of the work, i.e. lift 50 pounds
 - any ADA accommodation requirements
 - health history with signed declaration by student that the report is correct to the best of their knowledge
 - annual declaration by student that health status is unchanged to the best of their knowledge
- Immunizations:
 - Mumps, Rubella, Rubeola (MMR); medical documentation of 2 MMRs, 1 month apart, with the 1st dose after the first birthday, and the 2nd dose at least 1 month thereafter; or titers
 - Varicella; 2 doses of varicella vaccine 4 weeks apart; or titer
 - Hepatitis B; medical documentation of 3 dose series (may be started upon admission to clinical program); or titer; or declination form signed by student
- Seasonal Influenza Vaccinations (annually per CDC recommendations or declination on file):
 - medical documentation of annual immunization
 - if student identifies a “medical exemption”, documented validation by primary care provider required
 - if student identifies a “religious exemption”, documented validation by clergy required
 - if valid exemption documentation is on file, student may sign annual declination form as a self report
- TB Skin Test (prior to initial clinical start then annually)
 - A two-step skin test with negative results within 3 months of initial clinical start for students who have never had a skin test done
 - A skin test with negative results within 3 months of clinical start for students with documented history of previous skin tests
 - Subsequent annual skin test with negative results annually for all students
 - Quantiferon TB test acceptable in lieu of annual TB skin test
- Chest X-Ray (negative chest x-ray post TB skin test conversion, with annual symptom survey)
 - Documented validation of negative chest x-ray dated post positive TB skin test conversion
 - Student to complete annual report of health/symptom survey
 - If a student is positive for active TB disease, they must participate in an active treatment plan to be reviewed annually
 - Student not eligible to participate in clinical practicum until such time as medical provider determines that they are not communicable
- 10 Panel Urine Drug Screen (prior to initial clinical start):
 - a negative result will require no further screens unless indications of impairment are present, in which case additional screens may be requested.
 - If there is a break in a student’s enrollment, the urine drug screen will need to be repeated.
 - If a student has a current positive drug screen result, they will not be able to participate in a clinical placement.
- Criminal Background Check
 - Complied with the provisions of WI Caregiver Background Check law and student has negative record or, if the student has been convicted of a crime, the positive report has been sent to Froedtert Health’s Education Coordinator. Froedtert Health’s Human Resources Manager will review the positive report for a determination whether the student will be permitted to participate in student activities at Froedtert Health facility.
